When they have babies, the count is usually 400,000, and the mother octopus guards her babies with her life. It takes 5 months before the babies hatch and are free to explore.

There are many species of octopus. The blue-ringed octopus located in Australia is lovely to look at but make sure that's all you do. Being the smallest octopus (5-8 inches), it packs a punch. Their venom is so strong that one dose can kill 26 adults. Best to stay out of their way.
